## Shahada

#### Shahada

The Shahada, "There is no god but Allah, and Muhammad is His Prophet", is the Islamic declaration of faith.

## Muhammad

#### Muhammad

- c. 570–632 AD
- the final prophet sent by Allah
- At 40, Muhammad received his first revelation from the Angel Gabriel
- He preached Tawhid (monotheism) and social justice, facing persecution from Meccan elites.
- Muhammad died in Medina in 632 AD

- Allah sent divine scriptures:
  - Torah (Tawrat), Psalms (Zabur), Gospel (Injil), and the Quran (final revelation)
- Quran
  - revealed to the Prophet Muhammad over approximately 23 years (610–632 CE) through the Angel Gabriel.

- Quran
  - final and complete revelation
  - supersedes Torah and Gospel
  - 114 chapters (surahs) arranged roughly from longest to shortest (not chronologically)
  - divided into verses (ayahs)

- Hadiths
  - recorded sayings, actions, and approvals of the Prophet Muhammad
  - compiled by his companions and later scholars
  - Sahih al-Bukhari and Sahih Muslim (most authoritative)

- Tawhid
  - foundational concept of Islamic theology
  - the absolute oneness and unity of Allah (God)
  - Surah Al-Ikhlas (112): "Say, He is Allah, [who is] One, Allah, the Eternal Refuge. He neither begets nor is born, nor is there to Him any equivalent."

- Shirk
  - antithesis of Tawhid
  - associating partners with Allah
  - unforgivable if unrepented (Quran 4:48)
  - the most severe sin
  - Trinity doctrine is Shirk

- Jesus (Isa in Arabic
  - major prophet and messenger of Allah, but not as divine or the Son of God
  - one of the Ulul Azm along with Noah, Abraham, Moses, and Muhammad
  - virgin born, performed miracles, preached Tawhid, Torah to Israel
  - not crucified

- Jesus (Isa in Arabic)
  - will return in end-times
  - will break the cross,
  - abolish jizyah (tax on non-Muslims),
  - eventually die a natural death
  - (according to Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)
